CONGRESS.—In the Senate yesterday, Mr. Benton, from the Committee on Military Affairs, reported a bill to increase the pay of the Surgeons and Assistant Surgeons in the United States Army, which was ordered to a second reading.

Mr. Smith's resolution proposing an inquiry into the expediency of suppressing the circulation of bills of a denomination less than five dollars, was adopted. The consideration of the Apportionment Bill was renewed, and the discussion was continued by Messrs. Clayton, Tazewell, Ewing, and Webster—but no question was taken.

In the House of Representatives, Mr. WARDWELL presented resolutions adopted by the Legislature of the State of New York, in opposition to the re-charter of the Bank of the United States. Mr. WICKLIFFE, from the Committee on the Public Lands, reported a bill for the final adjustment of private land claims in the State of Missouri.

The resolution for the appointment of a Select Committee to examine the affairs of the Bank of the United States, was again taken up. Mr. Clayton, resumed and concluded his remarks in favour of the resolution, in a speech of about three hours' length, Mr. Root has the floor for to-day.
