Congress.-In the Senate yesterday, Mr. Benton, from the Committee on Military Affairs, reported a biil to increase the pay of the Surgeons and Assistant Surgeons in the United States Army, which was ordered to a second

reading.

Mr. Smith's resolution proposing an inquiry into the expediency of suppressing the circulation of bills of a denomination less than five dollars, was adopted. The consideration of the Apportionment Bill was renewed, and the discussion was continued by Messrs. Clayton, Tazewell, Ewing, and Webster-but no question was taken.

In the House of Representatives, Mr. WARD-WELL presented resolutions adopted by the Legislature of the State of New York, in opposition to the re-charter of the Bank of the United States. Mr. WICKLIFFE, from the Committee on the Public Lands, reported a bill for the final adjustment of private land claims in the

State of Missouri.

The resolution for the appointment of a Select Committee to examine the affairs of the Bank of the United States, was again taken up. Mr. Clayton, resumeda nd concluded his remarks in favour of the resolution, in a speech of about three hours' length, Mr. Root has the floor for to-day.
