Mr. Wayne concluded his rei marks in favor of his amendment, which he modified by striking from it that part which required the committee to act in the recess. After a further debate of some length, a part of which was of a personal character, the question was taken and the amendment rejected—yeas 26, nays 164. Mr. Adams then proposed to amend the original resolution by limiting the enquiry to the alleged violations of the charter of the Bank, &c., and directing the Committee to report by the 21st of April. Several ineffectual attempts were made to amend this amendment so as to extend the proposed enquiry, when it was finally adoptedyeas 106, nays 92. The resolution thus amended was agreed to, the Committee directed to consist of seven, and the House at 8 o'clock, adjourned.
