Mr. Webb of the Courier & Enquirer has been examined by the bank committee. We are impatient to hear who were the "men" and whose were the "votes" that the bank has been "buying like cattle in the market," and which "press" has had its "energies withered by a subtle poison." But we remember Mr. James Gordon Bennett claimed to have said these hard things of the bank. They were said, however, when he was not a proprietor, and not advertised as an editor. They were said some time last winter, whereas Mr. Bennett became a proprietor of the country paper only, after Mr. Noah's name was taken out of that paper, which was on the 10th June, 1831. Mr. Noah's name disappeared from the daily paper, silently, on the 12th May preceding. Dates are all important.
