In the House of Representatives, the whole of the

day was consumed in the further hearing of the case of alleged breach of the privileges of the House by Samuel Houston. Besides Debates and motions on incidental questions, the examination of the principal witness, Mr. Stanberry, the Member of this House alleged to have been assaulted, was concluded, many questions being put to him by the Council for the Respondent, but nothing materially new coming out in evidence, Mr. Cave Johnson, a Member of the House from Tennesse, was then sworn as a witness at the request of the Counsel for the Respondent, and delivered a narrative of the circumstances of the correspondence and conversations which preceded by some days the incident that gave rise to this investigation.
