

BANK OF THE UNITED STATES.

The report of the majority of the committee on the Bank of the United States was received in this city on Wednesday evening. It occupies seven or eight columns of the daily papers, exclusive of the documents, and is violently accusatory of the Bank. It states that Noah and Webb, editors of the New York Courier and Enquirer, got a large loan on the security of their own names; that five other editors, not named, also received large sums; that particular individuals have been accommodated with enormous loans, when smaller traders were thrown out; that the Bank has dealt in real estate, by building a canal basin and warehouses at Cincinnati, contrary to its charter, with many other particulars; dealing in stocks, &c. &c. We must wait till our next publication for the report of the minority, and then give an abstract of both. Our readers must bear in mind that Mr. Adams said there was scarcely a word in the report to which he could give his assent, and Col. Johnson, though he signed the report, does not go with it cordially. Let public opinion await a more full exposition.
