

BANK OF THE UNITED STATES.—The National Intelligence of Monday morning, printed a day in advance, contains the proceedings in Congress on Saturday. — They possess strong interest, and may be considered as highly favourable to the recharter of the Bank of the United States. — By a vote of one hundred to Seventy five, the House of Representatives refused to postpone the consideration of the Bank Bill until next session; and by a vote of one hundred and twelve to seventy two, the House rejected a motion made by Mr Clayton, the author of the minority report, to commit the bill to the Committee of the Whole on the State of the Union, which will prevent the possibility of the defeat of the measure, by protracted debate in such a committee, where the previous question is not applicable.
