

*The Bank of the U. States and the Nullifiers.*—In some comments last Spring, soon after the rising of Congress, on the subject of the Tariff compromise, we hazarded the opinion that the Bank of the U. States was the concealed, but true basis on which Henry Clay and Jno. C. Calhoun established that celebrated compact. We thought even at that early period that we saw symptoms sufficiently strong to warrant such an opinion. Facts have been gradually developing themselves since, calculated to strengthen it, and the course of the Nullifiers since the meeting of Congress this Winter, has placed the matter beyond all speculation. C. Calhoun, or for mere opposition to the Administration. It is now evident that opposition to the administration, and not principle, is to be the Polar Star of this faction in Congress. We find them enlisted and fighting side by side with Henry Clay, in behalf of the U. S. Bank. We should not be much surprised to hear next of their going with him for his unconstitutional, federal, consolidation Land Bill.
